The Water District was created in 1964 along with the financial help of Farmers Home Administration.

The District presently serves 8000 of its own residential customers, along with The City of La Grange, the 3 institutions of the Kentucky State Reformatory, and an emergency connection with Henry County Water. Communications have also begun with the Louisville Water Co.

We presently have the pumping capacity of 6 million gallons per day. In the hot dry months, we have reached this plateau.

The present treatment plant was built in 1981, with the expectation that it would last until 2010.

The present expansion should be good until the year 2025, unless there is another major building and development explosion in the near future which is not expected.

The new pumping capacity will be 13 M.G.D.

The newest project (which advertisements for bids should appear today in the Courier), our website, ([Oldhamcountywater.com](http://Oldhamcountywater.com)) and in Dodge Reports, will consist of the following:

1. 2 new 1500 to 1800 G.R.M. wells.
2. A new 24" raw water line, 4700 ft.
3. An addition-expansion to the existing treatment plant includes:
  - a. Exclusion of chlorine use, to sodium hypochloride (less volatile)
  - b. New telemetry-upgrade
  - c. Baffling of clearwells (better contact time)
  - d. Emergency standby gen set.
4. Finished water 30" & 36" D.I. Pipe 7200 Ft. to US 42 and reconnect to existing 24" & 12" to the distribution system. I-Creek Crossing (18 Mile Creek)  
No new customers will be added.
